### From the Secretariat

Dear Member,

We all grow old and when we grow older, we experience the full richness of human behavior. The brain helps us to think and feel, to remember and create and wonder about the world we live in and about ourselves. We always wonder how it all happens. There is always a need to know what is the neurological basis of racism - the fear and hatred of people who are socially and culturally different? Do terrorism and crime get built into human brain circuits? Why do man knowingly contribute to self-destruction? Perhaps, only neuroscience can ultimately address all these issues and more. This is why Professor P.N. Tandon once said: "The greatest challenge to biologists lies in understanding the human behavior, for ultimately the destiny of man depends upon better understanding of human behavior which in turn is governed by the brain itself".

Neuroscience has been one of the thrust areas of most funding agencies of Govt. of India involved in developing academic and research centers as well as human resource development. Our senior scientists have been making sincere efforts to develop the subject very effectively and helped the various agencies in identifying individuals and groups with potential and interest in taking up research in neuroscience as their career. We still have limited human resource and there is always a need to encourage young scientists to take-up challenges of neuroscience.

Indian neuroscientists have also become greatly interested in various aspects of the functioning of the brain and the remedies of its malfunctioning. The Indian Academy of Neurosciences is an integrated forum that provides a platform to all neuroscientists of the country to come together and discuss the problems, possibilities and tenure of neuroscience. The Academy tries to help the growth of the subject and individuals interested in it. The Academy has around 430 life members, 13 honorary members, 30 fellows and several ordinary members. The official journal of the Academy, Annals of Neurosciences has qualitatively improved enormously during past two years. Now we have a Journal Endowment fund. This has been possible by the generous contribution from some of our members and we are thankful to all and would request the other members to join in this venture and contribute substantially. In addition, I would like to take this opportunity to request all the members of the Academy to contribute quality articles to the Journal with the spirit "charity begins at home".

There have been some important recent happenings. We have now been able to raise a endowment and instituted the "B.K. Bachhawat Life Time Achievement Award" w.e.f. 2002. We would like to express our gratitude to Dr. R.C. Srimal, Dr. B.N. Dhawan, Prof. P.S. Sastry, and Prof. J.S. Chopra for all their efforts and to all the members who have contributed towards this endowment.

Dr. Vijayalakshmi Ravindranath has been keenly following the IBRO activities and the Academy's representation at the International front. She has been instrumental in keeping the IBRO-IAN linkage alive.

The National Brain Research Centre has been very helpful to the neuroscientists by bringing them together through the NBRC-Neuroscience Centres networking activity. Such networking meetings have been most successful in identifying our strengths and in encouraging the subject. This is a challenge for both

NBRC and individual neuroscientists outside NBRC. The INDO-US Forum on Neuroscience Research and the Round Table on consciousness have been two important activities, which were attended by many of our members. Dr. John Miller our US collaborator with NBRC has contributed Rs. 31,680/- as a fund to meet travel of one young scientist attending the Academy's Conference every year. A Symposium on "Depression: Current Concepts and Management" was organized on January 23, 2002 at Lucknow by the Lucknow chapter of IAN at Industrial Toxicology Research Center, Lucknow. Dr. G.N. Pandey, Professor of Psychiatry at Univ. of Illinois, Chicago and Fellow of the Academy was the key speaker. The other speakers were Dr. Devika Nag, the then President of the Academy, Prof. Atul Agarwal and Prof. Anil K. Agarwal. This branch also had an invited lecture of Professor D. Schiffmann in December 2001 on Application of Microelectrode Array Biosensors in Toxicology.

While we have identified neuroscience as a thrust area of research in our country, there is a paucity of scientists to work in the subject. We have limited trained human resource and there is always a need to encourage young students to take up the challenges of neuroscience. Recognizing the need of trained human resource and getting inspired by the neuroscience events in the country, the Jiwaji University, Gwalior has recently made some efforts. The Neuroscience Centre at Jiwaji University, Gwalior has introduced a two years M.Sc. Neuroscience programme which is truly interdisciplinary and involves inter-institutional teaching. Most of our visiting professors to this programme have been leading members of the Academy. As of today, the University is on its way to upgrade this center to a University Teaching Department for teaching and research leading to M.Sc., Ph.D. and D.Sc. degrees in Neuroscience.

It is a pleasure to inform that several of our members have been honored with Honors and Awards. I only came to know of a few of them. I have mentioned them below. Please do let me have more such information that we can share and feel proud of.

### NOMINATIONS FOR ACADEMY'S AWARDS INVITED

There will be competitions for the four awards of the Academy:

- **Tulsa Bai Somani Education Trust Award:** For best oral presentation by young neuroscientist below 40 years of age at the annual conference. The nominee has to submit the MSS of the paper in 3 copies to the General Secretary of the Academy at least 6 weeks prior to the meeting for peer reviewing. The papers awarded shall be published in the official journal of the Academy 'Annals of Neuroscience'.
- **D. M. Kar Prize:** For best oral presentation by young neuroscientist below 35 years of age at the annual conference. The nominee has to submit the MSS of the paper in 3 copies to the General Secretary of the Academy at least 6 weeks prior to the meeting for peer reviewing. The papers awarded shall be published in the official journal of the Academy 'Annals of Neuroscience'.
- **Professor S. S. Parmar Foundation Award:** For best poster presentation by young neuroscientist below 35 years of age at the annual conference.
- **Jyotsnamoyee Raghunath Bhattacharya Award:** For research publication in the field of basic neuroscience that includes the disciplines of Neuroanatomy, Neurophysiology, Neurochemistry, Neuropharmacology, Neuroimmunology and Neurotoxicology. The paper should have been published during past 2 years with respect to the year of the award. The age of the awardee shall not exceed 40 years. In case of multi-authored publication, the awardee must be the first author and at least one of the authors should be a member of the Academy. Please send 3 reprints/copies of the paper.

All nominations for the awards should reach the General Secretary on or before **5<sup>th</sup> January 2003**. A Nominee for the awards must be an IAN Member with good standing.

Pre-GB meeting of the Executive Committee of IANS was held on 28-01-2001 in the Department of Neurology, King George Medical College, Lucknow.

Prof. J. N. Sinha, the President of IANS welcomed the members and presided over the meeting. At the outset, silence was observed as a mark of respect and prayer for those who lost life following tragic earthquake which has caused tremendous human sufferings in Gujarat state. Members prayed for the peace of departed souls and grant of strength to withstand the loss for the members of the bereaved families.

Minutes of the previous GB meeting were reviewed and the actions taken/initiated were noted. Among the major decisions of the previous GB meeting were reviving the official NEWSLETTER and the JOURNAL of the organization the responsibility of which were entrusted to the Secretary and the newly appointed Editor of the Journal Prof. A. M. Kar, respectively.

Secretary and the editor informed the members about having re-started the official NEWSLETTER and the JOURNAL of the organization. Regarding the reason for not being able to come out with the second edition of the Newsletter, the secretary stated that there were no news items coming from the members, which needs to be looked into. He sought the opinion of the members to consider the feasibility of including invited commentaries/write ups about the matters related to neuroscience such as priorities in neuroscience in Indian context, the lack of infrastructure to pursue cutting edge of science in Indian scenario etc., which may be thought provoking. Availability of such materials may keep the regular publishing of the NEWSLETTER along with the news items that may be flowing from the members.

Secretary also informed the members of about New Membership Directory being brought out, the copies having handed over to the Treasurer for distribution. Members were told that the information regarding the pending updating of the said directory was informed through the NEWSLETTER published, soliciting corrections regarding the change of address, if any, needs to be incorporated in the newer edition. Whatever the (limited number) corrections received from the members were incorporated in the new Directory. He also pointed out the inclusion of By-Laws of the organization, in the new directory brought out, for the benefit of members.

Members were also told about the secretary of having raised the required money through advertisement towards the expenditure towards both the NEWSLETTER and the new edition of DIRECTORY brought out. The remaining balance amount was transferred to corpus fund of the organization.

Regarding the corpus fund for the Journal, it was decided that each of the EC members to contribute Rs.1000/-and the same spirit may be inculcated among the members during the GB meeting. Suggestion was accepted and some of the members (Drs. K.C. Singhal, M. Hussein, P.K. Seth, V. Ravindranath, Devika Nag and K. T. Shetty) on the spot committed their payment towards this cause.

Committee appreciated the Editors efforts in bringing out the journal. Editor called upon the EC members to motivate the other members to contribute articles for the journal so that the continuity can be maintained. It was also decided that the EC members to come forward to submit their manuscripts to the journal as an exemplar action to promote the official journal.

The issue regarding the status quo of proposed Prof. Bachhawat Memorial Corpus fund to institute an award for lifetime achievement in neurosciences in India. Dr. R.C. Srimal briefed the members about the efforts on the part of the committee constituted for the purpose of which himself and Prof. P.S. Shastry were the members. It was given to understand that in spite of several attempts by the said committee to raise fund the response was very poor. However, the Lucknow chapter of IANS was able to mobilize sizeable amount (**Attn: Dr. Patro: please include the exact amount, information of which may be with Dr. A. K. Agarwal, Treasurer**) towards this. Dr. K. T. Shetty informed the members about the decision of organizing committee of XV Annual meeting of IANS held at Bangalore to donate Rs. 11,111/- for the corpus fund in memory of Prof. Bachhawat and also told that two of the IANS members from NIMHANS having contributed Rs.1001 each for this purpose. It was suggested that the proposed award in memory of Prof. Bachhawat be introduced with effect from the year 2002.

Dean was authorized to constitute various committees to evaluate the presentations/papers/posters for different awards.

Committee was informed about Dr. V. Ravindranath, one of the vice presidents of IANS, having been appointed as the Director of NBRC, New Delhi and was congratulated on this new assignment. EC also

noted, with a sense of appreciation, about the extension of Prof. G.N. Pandey as a member of NIH study section for the second term. Dr. V. Ravindranath informed that IANS has been recognized by IBRO and has agreed to get an official communication to that effect and pass on the same to the IANS secretariat for record purpose. Committee also noted with appreciation to the recognition conferred on to Dr. A.K. Agarwal and Dr. V. Ravindranath as member of CINB. EC also nominated Dr. V. Ravindranath as an official nominee to IBRO. Further the committee also suggested that NBRC might be asked to bear the IBRO international membership of IANS.

It was decided to have a better communication with international members of IANS through secretary of international affairs of IANS Secretariat to take appropriate steps to initiate action on this.

Dr. K. T. Shetty, the secretary informed the EC that having completed two years of tenure he wants to be relieved of the responsibility of secretary. EC went through the nominations received for the various posts and prepared the list to be presented before GB for its consideration.

EC appreciated the service of outgoing president, secretary and other office bearers. Meeting ended with vote of thanks from the secretary.
